Digital archaeology, 3D scanning and photogrammetry

iSCAN has been evolving in the field of technological innovation for several years and has carried out numerous 3D digitization projects related to archeology and heritage. As part of the CNEHA 2023 conference, we are offering an introductory workshop on 3D scanning and

photogrammetry in archaeology. This workshop aims primarily to answer the following questions: what is 3D scanning? How does it work? And why do we do it?

The workshop includes a theoretical component where the basic principles of photogrammetry are explored, followed by an overview of the different methodologies, from data capture and data processing to online publication. Everything is accompanied by a few practical examples carried out by the iSCAN team over the past few years to illustrate the different capture contexts, the results obtained, and the variety of possibilities for the enhancement of data. Finally, the presentation addresses a broader discussion on the issues related to 3D digitization, the ethical considerations behind the use of these new technologies and the recognition of the limits concerning the processing, dissemination, and storage of data.

iSCAN also offers a more hands-on photogrammetry session where the participants will be invited to scan their own objects. The goal is to demonstrate live the process of capturing and processing data.
