### **Sherds for Nerds: An Introduction to Archaeological Dating with Ceramics**

Instructed by Silas Hurry and Patricia Samford 9:00 AM- 4:00 PM

This professional enrichment workshop is divided into two distinct sections: Colonial ceramics of the 17th and 18th centuries and printed ceramics of the 19th century. The session will also include a brief introduction to using vessel shapes on refined earthenware as a dating tool. Participants will receive a certificate attesting to their attendance. These two presentations will be designed to be very hands-on with the opportunity to study and photograph type examples. A bibliography for each segment will be provided in addition to some specific hand-outs. ### **Maryland Archaeological Conservation Lab (MAC Lab) Tour**

9:00AM to 12:00PM (Leaves from and returns to hotel)

Take a tour of the Maryland Archaeological Conservation Laboratory (MAC Lab), home to over 10 million archaeological artifacts and one of the largest conservation labs in the United States. The MAC Lab serves as a clearinghouse for archaeological collections recovered from land-based and underwater projects conducted by State and Federal agencies throughout Maryland. The lab is located at Jefferson Patterson Park and Museum, which encompasses 560 scenic acres along the Patuxent River with more than 65 identified archaeological sites and 9,000 years of documented human occupation. Lab staff will lead the tour, which will take about 1.5 to 2 hours. The lab is located at Jefferson Patterson Park & Museum, the State Museum of Archaeology, in St. Leonard, about a thirty-minute drive from the conference hotel.

1:00 to 4:00PM (Leaves from Farthings Gift Shop)

Take a walking tour of Historic St. Mary's City led by staff of the museum's Department of Research and Collections. As they walk the landscape, participants will hear the archaeological stories behind reconstructed colonial sites such as the historic Town Center, Brick Chapel, and home of Garrett van Swearingen. The tour will then go behind-the-scenes at the Department of Research and Collections Laboratory and will end with a visit to the ongoing excavations at the site of St. Mary's Fort. This approximately three hour tour will be predominantly outdoors, rain or shine, and will include walking moderate distances.
